Previously unlicensed drivers who are 18 years old must hold an instruction permit for at least 6 months prior to applying for a full license; 19 year olds must hold an instruction permit for at least 3 months. Additionally, you may also be required to repass both tests if your drivers license has expired and you want to renew it. New residents of Minnesota with outofstate licenses that have been expired for over 1 year will also be required to take the onroad test. If you are under 18 years of age you must also have parental consent. Passing the written test will earn you a motorcycle instruction permit, which is required in order to take the onroad test and receive your motorcycle endorsement. Additionally, boaters also have the option of taking an online safety course offered by BoatEd.com or requesting a home study packet from the DNR website.
