Firearms safety training courses in Ontario are overseen by the Firearms Safety Education Service of Ontario to teach students how to safely handle, use, transport and store firearms. The Canadian Firearms Safety Course CFSC was developed in partnership with the provinces and territories, national organizations with an ongoing interest in firearms safety, and many firearms and hunter education course instructors from across Canada. This course was developed to meet the mandatory requirements of section 7 of the Firearms Act. This course consists of one day of classroom instruction followed by a written and practical test. By successfully completing the CFSC a person is eligible to apply for a Possession and Acquisition Licence PAL to obtain nonrestricted firearms.

Instead of obtaining a Minor's Possession Licence, a minor may use firearms while under the immediate and direct supervision of a fully licensed adult. The duration of this course is 6.5 hours followed by a written exam. By completing the Hunter Education Course, in addition to the CFSC, participants meet the requirement to obtain provincial resident licences to hunt with a firearm or bow. Hunters must carry their OIC, along with the appropriate hunting licence, while hunting with a firearm. Hunters travelling to other parts of Canada should carry their OIC as proof of completing Hunter Education training requirements. The Criminal Code defines the main categories of firearms, which include restricted, prohibited, and nonrestricted firearms. The Firearms Act regulates the possession, transport, and storage of firearms. Applicants are also subject to background checks, which take into account criminal, mental health, addiction, and domestic violence records. Studies have attempted to evaluate three different periods of reform, which involved Bill C51 in 1977, Bill C17 in 1991, and Bill C68 in 1995. The recent decline in the rate of firearm homicides is mainly due to a drop in the rate of homicides committed with a handgun, which has fallen nearly 30% over the past four years. A PAL is required to possess, acquire, borrow, or acquire ammunition for a firearm anywhere in Canada. The PAL is the only licence issued to new adult firearms licence applicants in Canada; it is both required and the only permissible document for a person to acquire or permanently import a firearm. Applicants for a PAL must be 18 years of age or more. In other words, while a PAL with appropriate endorsements may permit a person to purchase a restricted firearm, it does not in itself permit that person to transport it from the store to their home. This particular case can become an endorsement on a PAL. For nonrestricted firearms separate authorization to transport is not required. All POLs were converted to PALs. In the Canadian system, there are three classes of firearms and firearm licences nonrestricted, restricted and prohibited. Licences are typically valid for five years and must be renewed prior to expiry to maintain all classes. If an individual possessing a PAL is convicted of certain offences, a PAL can be revoked. If an individual does not renew their PAL prior to its expiration date or if they have their PAL revoked, they must legally dispose of any firearms in their possession. A licence for prohibited firearms can be issued to qualifying businesses, and very rarely to individuals firearms they own, as the gun laws changed over time. Previous convictions for serious violent, drug or weapons offences almost invariably result in the denial of the application. In many provinces, however, applicants are also able to challenge the nonrestricted and restricted licence examinations without completing the respective safety courses.

In most cases, the nonrestricted class is a prerequisite to obtain the restricted licence, but both examinations can be challenged at the same time. The examinations contain both a written and practical component. All applicants are screened and a mandatory 28 day waiting period is imposed on firsttime applicants. Whereas the FAC was only required to acquire a firearm, a PAL is required to both acquire and possess firearms and to acquire ammunition. A PAL for nonrestricted firearms allows its holders to acquire and possess any nonrestricted firearm, while a PAL for restricted firearms which also covers prohibited firearms to those eligible allows the holder to acquire and possess restricted firearms. There is no longer a licensing requirement for purchasing crossbows. An unattended nonrestricted firearm left in a vehicle must be locked in the trunk or other compartment, if one is available. In order to transport restricted or prohibited firearms, an individual must obtain an authorization to transport. An ATC for open carry is usually only issued to employees of armoured car companies or for other limited employment reasons. As with any activity that carries with it an inherent risk if not properly adhered to, passing your test should not be the final destination of your journey, but rather the first milestone that you should look to surpass with the highest level of confidence and ability. A Assume every firearm is loaded You don't even need to touch the firearm to do this. Even if someone you trust has assured you that the firearm isn't loaded, if ends up in your hands, it's your responsibility to check.

The firearm should always be pointed in a direction that should it discharge, there would be no injury as well as minimal to no property damage. S See that the firearm is unloaded, PROVE it safe. While we are all for creating redundancy in safety training, the first 4 letters are already covered with the final letter, E, being the only unique step. That said, it is an important part of the safety course and something you should be comfortable demonstrating. This is preferably done with a cleaning rod or some other bore observing device. Some students have prior knowledge and experience with firearms and view the training as simply a formality, or nuisance to endure. Often times it is these same students who have the most difficulties when it comes to passing the course. Having grown up using firearm from a very young age, and working in the firearms community for over 25 years even longer if you count child labour at gun shows, I still learning new things on a regular basis. Remember, your instructor knows exactly what is needed for you to be successful in your training, so take advantage of that knowledge. Even if you violate all of the other safety principles, but at least adhere to this one, the firearm could discharge but at least nobody was hurt. If you were to point a firearm at yourself or another during your test, it is an automatic fail. Yes, aside from actively firing the gun when you have made that conscious decision, there can be times when a finger would need to be put on a trigger of a firearm that has been proven to be unloaded such as removing a bolt, or disassembling some firearms, but for the test, keep the finger away from

the trigger. We are constantly learning new things about firearms, and that only happens through our willingness to learn. Perhaps you have used that same make and model of firearm in the past and figure the one you are being tested on will work in the same way only to learn that it doesn't.

Or perhaps the process of disabling the firearm for training purposes, or having the classroom firearms be handled by numerous other students, has introduced some peculiarities you wouldn't otherwise find. Take your time and make sure you are comfortable handling every action. If you aren't, ask the instructor to assist you. You are there to learn and asking questions is how we learn. Chances are, if you are thinking about it, likely others in the class are also wondering, but they may be too shy to ask. You can ask your questions in front of the group, or take the instructor aside if it's something you wish to ask in private. Trust me, if your instructor is worth their salt they will definitely welcome the questions.
